




Spring Water

- Rain and surface water seep through layers of granite and pick up minerals:
 - Carbon dioxide, arsenic, and sodium chloride (aid digestion)
 - Calcium carbonate (helps with kidney stones)
 - Magnesium carbonate (helps with indigestion)
- Flow is approximately 1 gallon per minute


