BACKGROUND

- Purpose re-evaluate the 2012 Drought Contingency
 Plan to determine if modifications are warranted.
- Study recommends a Drought Contingency Plan that would improve management of water resources for all authorized purposes during prolonged low inflows.
- Study sponsors Georgia Department of Natural Resources Environmental Protection Division, the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources, and The Nature Conservancy.

EVALUATION PROCESS

- Six alternatives were studied then evaluated
- Organized 50+ metrics into groups by project purpose
 - Flood Risk Management
 - Recreation
 - Fish & Wildlife
 - Hydropower
 - Water Quality
 - Water Supply
 - Navigation
- For each project purpose, compared each alternative's benefits over the existing plan (NAA_200)
- Assumed each project purpose had <u>equal</u> weighting
- Select alternative with highest cumulative benefits





STATUS OF DROUGHT PLAN

- Modeling completed and DO impacts to Savannah Harbor assessed (3/30/18)
- Report drafted and released for public review (6/12/18)
- Draft report reviewed by public for 30 days completed (7/12/18)
- Work suspended due to unbalanced cost share (8/17/18)

Next Steps in Progress:

- Receipt of sponsor funding and/or work-in-kind
- Complete a Programmatic Agreement (60 days)
- Complete of FWSC Act requirements (30 days)
- Finalize Coastal Zone Management requirements (30 days)

- Drought Contingency Plan Approved by SAD mid-May 2019








Figure 1: Project Location Map
